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### Executive Director Report Spring Society Meeting – May 26, 2025

It is hard to believe that the school year is almost over, but here we are! It's been a good year at Immanuel Christian Schools – we have so much to be thankful for.

Within the Society office, it has been a busy spring. Thank you to everyone who was a part of the spring bazaar! It was a great day, filled with lots of laughter and conversation. It was also very successful, with \$80,000 being raised for the High School Accessibility and Modernization project – thank you!

We have also been busy planning for the upcoming school year, including working with new families who are looking to enroll their children at ICS. To date, 17 families have been accepted into Society membership, with seven families awaiting interviews. It's really exciting to hear from parents who are wanting Christian education for their children.

We like to refer to the work being done in the Society office as taking care of the 3B's – Buildings, Buses and Bible.

### <u>Buildings</u>

 Work has already begun on the High School Accessibility and Modernization Project. This project will include the creation of a fully accessible bathroom, a barrier free bathroom, newly renovated men & women's bathrooms, and additional break-out space for students, as well as fresh paint and new lockers in the high school wing. The project is scheduled to be finished by the end of August, with things ready to go for when students return in September.

### <u>Buses</u>

- This past year we have been running 10 buses, which is one more route than in previous years. The number of families requesting transportation services remains strong.
- Earlier this spring, we said goodbye to one of our drivers, Kevin Millward, as he moved to a different job. We're grateful to Harley Middel, who has very capably covered that route for the remaining school months!
- We are always looking for spare bus drivers, so if you know of anyone who is interested, please ask them to contact Jason Ferrie.
- We are very thankful for the additional transportation funding that we received from the provincial government again this spring. This funding, similar to the lease funding we have received from the province in the past for our buildings, is not guaranteed year over year, so the Board is being very intentional and thoughtful of how these funds are used.

### <u>Bible</u>

- The Society was pleased to be able to financially support several initiatives this past year, including:
  - ICS teaching staff in attending the Prairie Centre for Christian Education (PCCE) Teacher's Convention in Taber
  - 3 teachers in participating in <u>Teaching for Transformation</u> 101.
  - Purchasing classroom sets of Bibles for ICSS Bible classes.
  - TfT lead teacher at ICES (0.3 position).
  - Prep time for ICSS teachers who are developing the new Bible curriculum.
  - ICS admin staff in attending the PCCE Leadership Cohort in Bragg Creek
